

**2014 CEDAR Student Dorm Information**  
**June 21 – 27<sup>th</sup> / 1201 NE Campus Parkway, Seattle, WA 98105**

**Location:**

- Students will be staying in the Lander Hall dorms located 3 blocks west of campus on NE Campus Parkway <https://www.hfs.washington.edu/housing/Default.aspx?id=1966>
- The University of Washington is a pedestrian campus; bring comfortable shoes and be prepared to walk.
- Plan on at least 15+ minutes to walk from the dorms to Kane Hall

**Check-in:**

- Upon arrival students need to check in at the front desk of **Lander Hall**. Lander Desk is open 24 hours a day and reachable by calling 206-543-0235. If arriving after 11:00pm you must call the Lander front desk for access to the building.
- **IMPORTANT** – keep careful track of room keys/conference cards and return them to the front desk before you leave. *Steep fees can be charged if they are lost and you will be held responsible for any costs incurred.*
- Wireless is available throughout the dorms, however, check with the front desk for the access information since it may not be the same as the event login.
- All resident rooms, balconies and public spaces in the residence halls are **smoke-free**, including outside areas or locations that are near the air supply of residential buildings.
- The dorms offer many other amenities such as laundry, convenience store, vending, microwave and shared TV lounges. Ask at the front desk of the dorm for details.
- Dorm rooms will have bedding, towels, soap and drinking cups. For those who prefer to bring their own linens and towels, choose a color other than white--this will help identify personal items.
- Some meals will be provided by CEDAR during the event. Any other food purchases are at the expense of the attendee.
- Parking is available for \$15/day and may be purchased when checking in.

**Check-out:**

- Students **must** check out by **11:00am** on the day indicated at registration. Baggage can be held at the front desk.

**Suggested Things to Bring:**

Guests are advised to bring an alarm clock, lounge wear (appropriate for common living areas), shower slippers, and an umbrella and/or raincoat.

**Weather:**

Seattle weather is generally mild, with temperatures averaging 70-80 F. Heat waves do occur periodically and campus buildings, including the residence halls, are not air-conditioned. A fan will be provided in each dorm room. Be prepared for cooler evenings and occasional rain showers.
